Beloved in Christ,

What follows are summaries of a variety of issues and concerns:

1 Attempts by The Episcopal Diocese to take over assets from those parishes that have disaffiliated from The Episcopal Church ---- the current focus is on the parishes whose property is deeded to The Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh. Most recently St James, Penn Hills, and All Saints, Rosedale chose to leave their property rather than agree to the demands of the Episcopal Diocese to disaffiliate from the ACNA, and pay large sums of money.

2 Christ's Church is now part of the Mutual Defense Agreement (MDA). We have joined with 13 other parishes whose property is deeded to "the Rector, Wardens, and Vestry" of each parish, to defend against the claims of TEC on our property.

3 Two members of our vestry (Steve Swencki and Charlie Baldwin) have resigned from the vestry. We have reluctantly accepted their resignations and are asking that they continue their commission responsibilities until new vestry are elected in April of 2012. Both have served our congregation admirably!

4 "Random Acts of Kindness" I am requesting that we each report good deeds we either do, receive, or witness anonymously to serve as encouragements to one another. We often see and hear so much bad news that I hope our "Random Acts...." will help us look for the Good in life. Cards for this ministry may be found in the pews. Notes and emails will also suffice. One final reminder: All reports are anonymous!

5 Sermon topics ---- If you have questions about scripture, theology, worship, or issues that you would like to have addressed in sermons, please pass that on to me either via pew cards, email, or mail.

6 Our finances have not as yet recovered to the point where we can restore the cuts made in ministries and staffing. Please bring your pledges up to date and if possible, increase by even a small amount.

7 Finally, as always, please keep the leadership of our parish and our diocese in your prayers, so that we may hear the Lord's voice and have the strength and courage to follow Him.

JULY 12, 2011 MINUTES

Meeting convened at 7:10 pm, immediately following Compline.

Members Present

Director of Youth Ministry's Report

Bill Owens is preparing his house for sale. Important dates for Youth Ministry:

- July 22 – Youth Yard Sale
- July 30 – Youth Car Wash
- August 8-12th Kid's Camp – 6-8pm;
- August 19th Youth Slob Fest.

Meeting with Simpsons and Owens

Bill will stay on and be available as able during the summer months. Coordination with Jeff & Leslie to hand over the reins will occur sometime during the course of the next 2 months. 68 seats reserved for the Pirates Game – TBA. Youth group is going to expand to become a family oriented group. Involvement from all is encouraged.

Minutes from June

Moved for approval by Gordon Graham, seconded by Derek Peske. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Noted that we are currently \$2,600 behind on our current budget. Annually this depicts a \$40,000 deficit. Ally expressed thanks for everyone's work on the audit. Kudos for David Leuthold's progress report and request for continuing support this past Sunday. Concerns were also expressed regarding the congregation's understanding of David's report. Treasurer's report moved for approval by Derek, seconded by David Leuthold. Motion passed pending audit.

Action Items

David Leuthold shared an article from Trinity Magazine regarding a parish that grew through sharing space with a Presbyterian parish and by directing their mission towards ministry of college students. This church chose the gospel versus their buildings with regard to litigation. They have, via strong commitment, grown over time.

David expressed desire to hopefully maintain our presence but, if necessary, move.

Steve Swencki reported on the TEC happenings and news regarding possible litigation. St James, Penn Hills is now being

rectored by V. Santiago.

Dave Leuthold suggested that we are unprepared for any kind of litigation. Larry commented that the need for an attorney is an absolute. Larry expressed the need to find out if the diocese has identified a dollar amount towards legal support. Gordon suggested that this may present a conflict with our negotiating team. Discussion followed. TEC must first meet with us and attempt to enforce the Dennis Canon.

Gordon expressed the congregational commitment to stand their ground until they are forced out. Chris reiterated this opinion.

Vestry entered into Executive Session at 8:02 pm. All non-vestry asked to leave.

Members Now Present

Larry Knotts, Gordon Graham, Bill Armstrong, Chris Mollica, Tim Moore, David Leuthold, Derek Peske, Steve Swencki and David Manson. Excused: Charlie Baldwin.

Discussion followed.

Bill Armstrong requested each of the vestry commit additional time and effort towards the mission of Christ's Church.

One office position was eliminated. All other positions received cuts in pay and

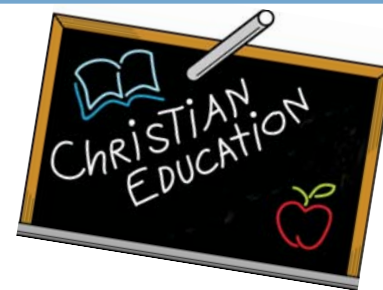

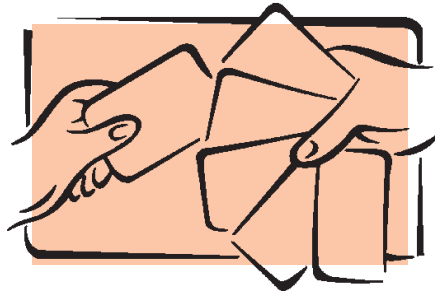

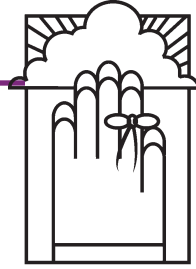
