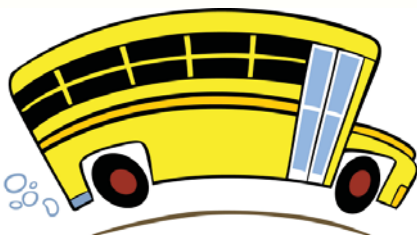

The Five-Finger Prayer



We were asked to reprint this simple, five-finger prayer, that's easy to remember for old and young, alike.

1. Your thumb is nearest you. So begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones is, as C. S. Lewis once said, a "sweet duty."
2. The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct, and heal. This includes teachers, doctors, and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.
- 3 The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the president, leaders in business and industry, and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They need God's guidance.
4. The fourth finger is our ring finger. Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger, as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble, or in pain. They need your prayers day and night. You cannot pray too much for them.
- 5.. And lastly comes our little finger - the smallest finger of all - which is where we should place ourselves in relation to God and others. As the Bible says, "The least shall be the greatest among you." Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. By the time you have prayed for the other four groups, your own needs will be put into proper perspective and you will be able to pray for yourself more effectively.

Beloved in Christ,

First and foremost in many of our minds is the ongoing dispute with The Episcopal Church (TEC) over the assets of our parish. Currently, TEC has focused primarily on the properties whose deeds are in the name of "The Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh." Christ's Church's deed is in the name of "the Rector, Wardens and Vestry of Christ's Church." The deeds of 13 other parishes are titled in similar wording. Rectors, Senior Wardens, and the Lead Negotiators of the fourteen parishes will be meeting as a group for an update in early September. Anything else that I could say would be pure speculation at this time.

We must stay focused on our mission to "worship God, and make known the love and salvation of Christ". We cannot become so distracted that we fail to serve the Lord Jesus. Fall is a time when folks often "try out" churches and when those who have been away for extended vacations return to worship and to their various ministries. Christian Education, 3:58 Youth Ministry, Christ's Church Women, and Fellowship will all be ramping up their ministries in the days ahead. We are actively seeking volunteers for the projection team, lay readers, altar guild, and office help, to name just a few.

Every one of us has been given gifts for ministry. The first requirement is to volunteer. There is an old saying about ministry that is still very true: "Ministry is 90% showing up!" If you are reading this letter, you have a gift for ministry! Our Lord has an adventure in mind for you. The question is, "How will you respond?" None of us is too young, too old, too rich, too poor, or too busy to serve Him in some way. When we meet Jesus face to face, the words we long to hear from Him are, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant!"

Finally, please bring your estimate of giving up to date. Consider increasing your giving if at all possible. We have made severe staff cuts, which hinder our ability to serve our parish in an efficient manner.

Most of all, please continue to pray daily for the leadership of our diocese, staff, vestry, and negotiating team. Pray that we would be attentive to the Lord's voice and have the wisdom and courage to follow and obey Him!

happened with the lawsuit from The Episcopal Church.

Steve Swencki received a bid for an appraisal from a company recommended by the Anglican Diocese of Pittsburgh. Gordon Graham also contacted an appraiser. Derek Peske moved to accept John Liza's bid to appraise both the church and the C.E. building, seconded by David Leuthold. Discussion ensued. Motion carried.

Minutes of Previous Meeting:

Derek Peske moved to accept the minutes of the April 14, 2011 Vestry meeting after adding the Rev. Lawrence Knotts' last name under the Resolution on Negotiating Team paragraph. Gordon Graham seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report:

Sue Akins reviewed the April, 2011, Balance Sheet and Income & Expense Statement, noting that the expenses for the month exceeded the income for the month. Most program expenses were under budget. Derek Peske moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, pending audit. Da-

vid Manson seconded. Motion carried.

The Reverend Knotts distributed the Vestry Person/Counter Sheet.

Gordon Graham moved to accept the following Deputies and Alternates for Convention: E. Derek Peske, Steve Swencki, Tim Moore deputies and alternates-Charlie Baldwin, Cindy Swencki, Bill Owens, and David Manson. David Manson seconded. Motion carried.

The Rev. Knotts called attention to the upcoming dates.

Discussion ensued on the future of Christ's Church and the mission opportunities that can be taking place in Greensburg and the world.

At 9:00 p.m., Derek Peske moved to adjourn, seconded by Gordon Graham. Motion carried.

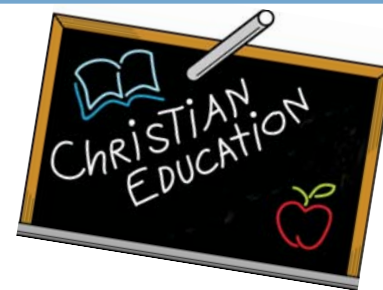

When announced, you get two Sundays to sign up. Don't forget to write it on your calendar! Our job would be so much easier if you would sign up rather than us trying to reach you by phone.

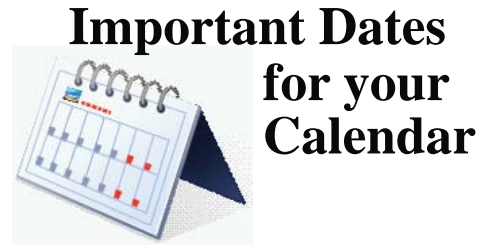
Leftover food is donated to the Union Mission in Latrobe, the only shelter in Westmoreland County serving disadvantaged men.

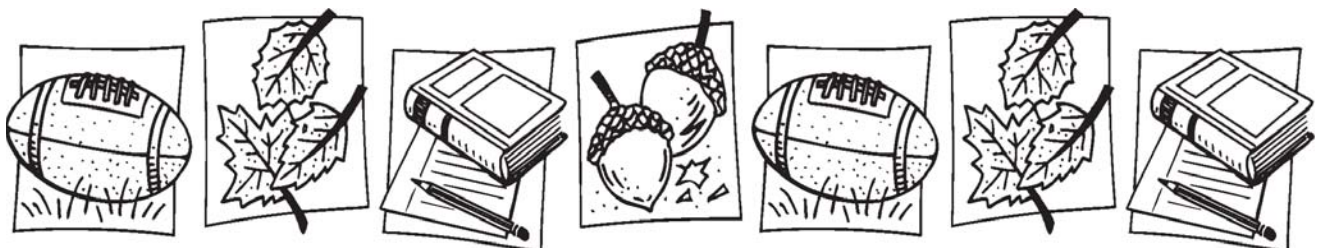

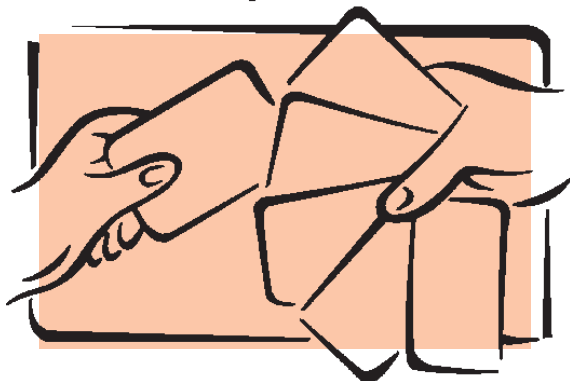

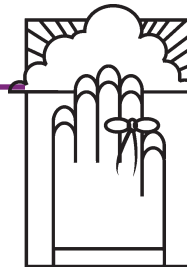
