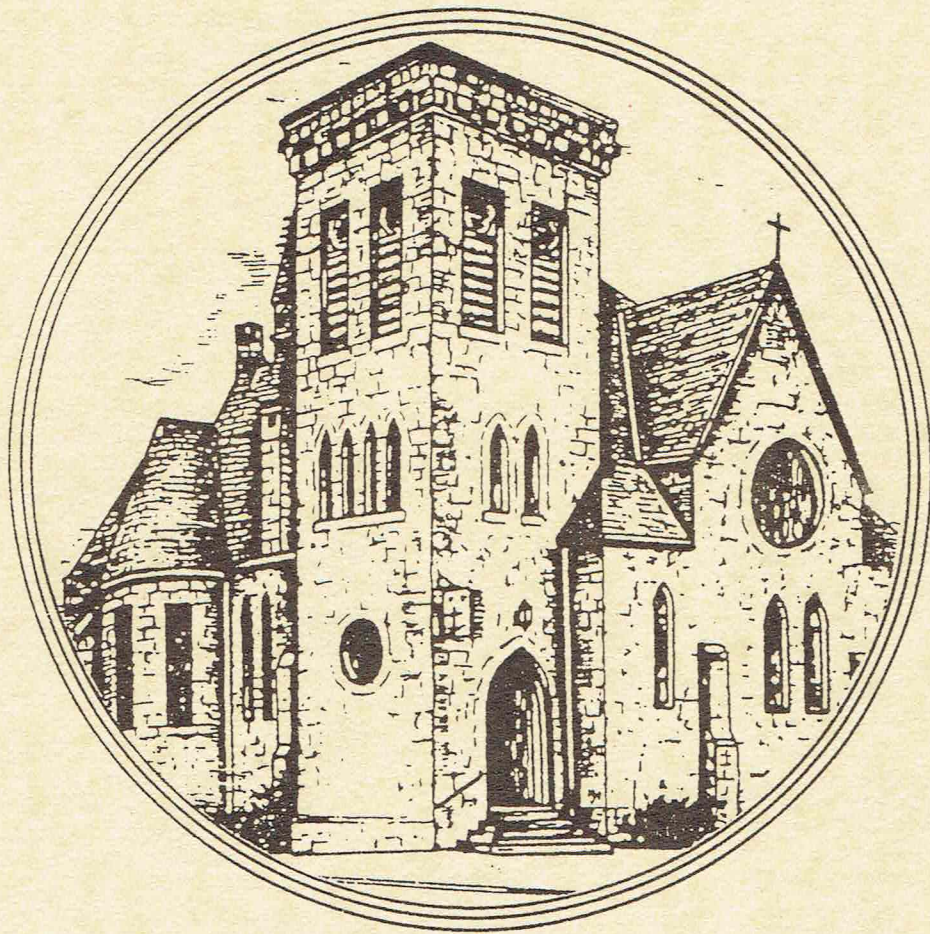

The Past 25 Years at Christ Church

Since the 150th Anniversary Booklet was presented in 1973, under the ministry of The Rev. David Van Dusen, much has happened in the world to fill future history books. The world paused as the Berlin Wall and the ideology it stood for crumbled. European and African nations, whose names were once part of our World Almanacs, have been swallowed up, conquered, or otherwise integrated to become known by names most of us are still learning to spell and pronounce. The Beatles strummed and drummed their way into the collector's galleries, Saddam Hussein is vying for his second nomination as one of the most notorious leaders in world history, outer space is getting crowded and, thanks to the magic of the "chip", the world gets smaller and smaller.

Americans celebrated this nation's bicentennial (1976) as only Americans are free to celebrate. The mercury of the New York Stock Exchange rocketed to new heights . . . and plummeted to new lows, making more than a few rethink where one stores one's treasures. We survived the resignation of one United States President and now await possible impeachment proceedings of another. Our space program is so progressive, we even recycled one of our astronauts, John Glenn.

Westmoreland County accommodated record numbers at the annual Air Show at Westmoreland County Airport, made improvements to its Courthouse, expanded its community college, and developed industrial parks while suffering the "groaning pains" of new highway development.

The City of Greensburg "Victorianized" Main Street with gas-like lighting, demolished century-old buildings, built new parking lots/garages, repaired bridges, and rerouted Main Street traffic. The Palace Theater, Train Station, and Troutman Building were renovated in the revitalization process.

The Episcopal Church had its share of headline space, not all of it positive or flattering, but reflective of the issues facing every conscientious Christian and Christ-centered organization entrusted with discerning the truth, protecting our apostolic traditions and spreading the Good News. We struggled with the questions of women's ordination, human sexuality, changes in the Prayer Book and hymnal, flexibility of worship styles, and defining our goals and vision for those in the kingdom who would inherit what we had wrought.

For Christ Episcopal Church, Greensburg, and its over 400 communicants, the last 25 years have been a witness to growth, change, concern, hope, celebration, preservation, integration, and example. Our headlines are chronicled in documents, journals, minutes, photographs, correspondence and storytelling, recording life as experienced by an American Christian in the latter quarter of this Century — birth, communion, confirmation/reception, marriage, dedication, installation, recognition and death — the epic of a loving, caring, supportive, ever-changing church family.

These pages are dedicated to those who are present and those who have been called away. All the times, places and activities that identify us as a church family are worthy of mention and will, undoubtedly, be recorded in The Big Book. As justice to so rich a history is not possible in only a few pages, the following "headlines" are intended to trigger additional recollections. Share your memories of people and activities with another, so that those coming after us will have even greater stores — and stories — from which to draw for the 200th Anniversary Book.

- The Reverend David Van Dusen left to answer call in Weston, Massachusetts. Jack Beavers headed Search Committee.

- Series of six seminars on the History of Anglicanism presented by Frank Keck.

1976

- The Rev. William Pickering installed as 34th Rector of Christ Church.

- Christ Church acquired former University of Pittsburgh classroom building on Maple Avenue, adding much needed office space, church school rooms, and space for outreach programs.

- The first issue of the parish newsletter, THE WORD, improved communication.

- Calling and Caring ministry began.

1977

- Commission System adopted at Vestry retreat, giving more delineated responsibility and authority over various areas of parish life.

- Storm windows installed in CE Building and protective sealing installed over stained glass windows.

1978

- ECW Salad Bars continued to benefit community agencies.

1979

- Diocese approved Assistant Minister, The Rev. James Ezell, and a Yoke Ministry began with St. Bartholomew's Church, Scottdale.

1980

- National economy impacted Christ Church, closing plants and businesses and creating an exodus affecting many active families.

1981

- Yoke Ministry ended with Assistant Minister being called to parish in North Carolina. Christ Church reevaluated programs/goals.

1982

- Christ Church Preschool began, with Christian ethics/philosophy geared to inquiring minds.

1983

- Fire struck the CE Building, with heavy damage to library and peripheral space.

- The Rev. Pickering answered call to St. Paul's, Mt. Lebanon. Ann Keck headed Search Committee; Parish Profile developed.

1984

- The Rev. Karl Ruttan called to Christ Church.

- Focus on small fellowship groups, parish development and outreach.

- Jim Thompson resigned as organist/choir director; Suzanne Newman hired to coordinate music.

- Christ Church supported Melody Patterson as missionary
