TWO
Mayflowers**



A group of religious separatists were granted permission to raise a colony in North America and responded to an advertisement for chartering an 11-year old vessel, the Mayflower, for transportation to make their dream come true later in 1620.

Approximately 35 of the separatists sailed on the Mayflower in mid-September with Captain Christopher Jones in command. The pilgrims lived most of the time on the gun deck with barely five feet of headroom. The rough voyage lasted 66 days with two passengers dying, but a baby girl was born at sea! Her name was Oceanus.

Finally, in November, they reached the shores of Cape Cod and sailed a month later to the mainland and settled in what would later become Plymouth, Massachusetts.

The Mayflower returned to England in 1621. Her eventual fate is unknown but, as the story goes, she was scrapped with some of her timbers used in the construction of a barn in Buckinghamshire, England.

In 1629 a second Mayflower sailed to the new colony and then attempted another voyage to Virginia in 1641. That ship and 140 passengers were never heard from again.



Favorite Recipes

WHEATIES COOKIES

1/2 cup Crisco
1 cup flour
1/2 cup white sugar
1/2 cup dark brown sugar, firmly packed
1/2 cup flaked coconut
1/2 tsp. vanilla extract
1/2 tsp. baking soda
1/4 tsp. baking powder
1 egg
1/4 tsp. salt
1 cup Wheaties cereal
(OR Honey Bunches of Oats)

Combine all ingredients, saving the coconut and cereal for last. Bake in 375 degree oven for 9 minutes for crunchy cookies and less for softer cookies.
