Our present church building is the third built for this parish. The first church was built in 1823, the second in 1851, and the third in 1891. It is of English Gothic style, with 23 beautiful stained glass windows that tell stories from the Bible.



Right Window

The Tiffany window was installed in 1914 on the Gospel side of the church and moved to its present position in 1937. In 1992, Pittsburgh Stained Glass Studios was hired to design and manufacture two new stained glass windows to complement the Tiffany window. The windows were removed, cleaned, and new windows created to match.

When the present church building was built, all of the windows, except for the ones in the North Transept, were multicolored panes of glass, as shown in this early photo of choir master, Jim Thompson (right).
