## Realizing Iome of the Changing Times We Live In

s summer approaches, I can't wait to enjoy the warm, summer evenings by a campfire or swimming in the pool with the sun beaming its golden rays. Growing up, I remember summer with some less than favorable memories such as bug bites and frequent trips to the emergency room. I was a bit of a daredevil, and they knew me at the two hospitals by my first name. Reflecting on hospitals and the excellent service they provide, I realize that times have changed not only in technology but also in ideology.

Back in the 1990s, our Congress passed legislation to provide better healthcare and continuity of care by making it easier for healthcare providers to speak with one another and to reduce abuse of the medical system. Thus, in 1996 the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act — more commonly known as HIPAA—became law. You experience it every time you try to get a prescription filled because of the seemingly endless amount of paperwork you have to sign and privacy safeguards you must read and acknowledge.

If you feel it's aggravating, imagine how the healthcare professionals feel! But failure to comply is not an option. The fines, loss of jobs, prison sentences, or closing of entire healthcare establishments are not only possible but have already happened. Protecting our right to privacy has come at a high cost.

One such cost is that hospitals no longer contact local clergy. In addition, most smaller and midsized hospitals have shuttered their chaplain positions. Receiving spiritual care in a hospital is not what it used to be. I remember walking in the hospitals and nurses would come up and direct me to rooms, even to people I did not know, to spend time and pray with them. Now, it is tough for me to gain any information, even a room number at times, when doing a pastoral visit. Unless I become a volunteer employee at every hospital in the area with scheduled visit times, I will not know who is in the hospital.

I've heard many reasons, from staffing to HIPAA, but no matter what the reason or excuse is, the fact remains they're not calling.

However, we can fix this. Keep telling the

medical providers caring for you know that you are a member of Christ's Church, Greensburg, the Anglican Church in Greensburg, and insist they call. But also call me or have a loved one call me and I will get there as soon as I can. Remember to call my cell phone if it's after hours.

I look forward to seeing you this Sunday and every Sunday at church and not have to worry about the hospitals! Have a blessed and safe summer!

Ceveral Parishioners have seen me in Lay Reader attire wearing a silver pectoral cross. Some even asked questions about it! Well, here is the story surrounding this cross and how I came to acquire it.

As residents in Summerville, SC, Cindy and I belonged to St. Paul's Summerville and I was a Lay Reader and Chalice Bearer there also. It is their custom for all Lay Readers and Chalice Bearers to wear a pectoral cross over the Surplice. If you did not own one, a wooden cross was provided.

Many of you are aware that my brother is a Russian Orthodox Priest, so I promptly called Dennis to see if he had any "extra" pectoral crosses. (I knew he had a very nice collection!) Dennis told me he had several that he could no longer wear as he has been elevated in the priesthood and must now wear jeweled pectoral crosses, so he sent me a couple. Upon receipt of them, I called him and asked for an explanation of the silver cross.

It turns out that this cross, known as St. Timothy's Cross, was his Ordination Cross. The last Czar of Russia, Nickolas II, began a custom of presenting this cross to all Russian Orthodox Priests at their Ordination. The tradition has continued to the present time. On the back is the inscription of award and the insignia and symbol of Nicholas II. On the front around the four arms of the Cross are the letters IC XC NIKA meaning **"Jesus Christ Conquers."** 



The back of the cross is also inscribed with the Apostle Paul's words to St. Timothy: *"Be an example to the believers in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity"* (1 Tim. 4:12).

Thus, the name: **St. Timothy's Cross**. BUT, the story of **THIS cross** does not end here! Stay tuned for Part II in the next issue of *The Word*!

t the April Vestry meeting the minutes from the March meeting were approved. Highlights of those minutes include the reading of a thank you from Our Daily Bread for a \$50 donation; acknowledgment that Freda Schultz has agreed to chair the food for undercroft events like the Annual Meeting; a motion to purchase new memorial linens costing \$169 from the Memorial Fund: an announcement that the first payment to the Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh is now due; and a report that the Youth's Pancake Supper was a huge success and enjoyed by all who attended.

The financial report showed income for March as \$22,639, with the year-to-date income being \$61,058. Expenses were \$20,435 for March and \$58,075 year-to-date. This means that our net gain year-to-date in the General Fund is \$2,983. Balance in the checking account was \$20,959 and \$145,695 in our investments.

The Vestry also agreed to support Nick Lynch in his pursuit of Holy Orders.

Our next meeting will be on May 14.

## **CREAM PUFF DESSERT**

Crust:

1 cup water <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup butter <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp. salt 1 cup flour **4** large eggs

Filling: 1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese. softened  $2\frac{1}{2}$  cups cold 2% milk 2 pkg. (3.4 oz. each) instant vanilla pudding

**Topping:** 1 carton (8 oz.) Cool Whip Chocolate syrup

In a large pan, over medium heat, bring the water, butter, and salt to a boil. Add flour all at once and stir until a smooth ball forms. Continue beating until smooth and shiny. Remove from heat and let stand for five minutes. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. (NOTE: Use whisk for best results.)

Pour into a greased 9" x 13" pan. Bake at 400 degrees until puffed and golden brown for about 28 to 30 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese, milk, and pudding until smooth. Spread over the crust; refrigerate for about 20 minutes. Spread Cool Whip over filling and refrigerate. Just before ser ing, drizzle with chocolate syrup.
